## PE development plan 2018-19



#### <u>Vision</u>

All pupils leaving primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport. To achieve this, we aim to provide quality physical activity opportunities both within and outside curriculum time which: considers the needs and interests of all pupils; promote positive attitudes towards participation in physical activity; enables pupils to develop a full range of basic movement skills; increases pupils' knowledge and understanding of the importance of physical activity; provides safe and stimulating areas in which children can play and be active.

#### The PE and Sports' Grant

We are estimated to receive, in total for the year 18/19, £19,150.

### 5 key indicators for improvement:

- The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school.
- The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement.
- •Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
- •Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
- Increased participation in competitive sport.

#### **Current aims:**

- 1. To increase participation in local school tournaments and events and raise the profile of sports at Wellesley Park Primary School.
- 2. To ensure high quality PE teaching
- 3. To develop the competence, creativity, performance and healthy lifestyle of all the children in our school.
- 4. To ensure that all staff have high quality professional competence throughout all areas of the PE curriculum.
- 5. To offer a broad curriculum that inspires the children to participate in a wide range of physical activities.
- 6. To give the children the confidence to compete against other schools.
- 7. To create an appropriate and challenging environment that will enable every child to fulfil their potential.
- 8. To make links with local sports clubs and the community to increase participation outside school.
