

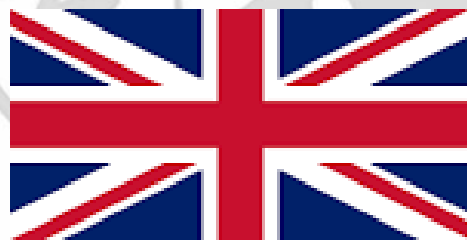
What is mutual respect?

Mutual respect is understanding that we don't all share the same beliefs and values. It includes respecting the values, ideas and beliefs of others whilst not imposing our own on others. People may not agree on everything but they are able to work things out.

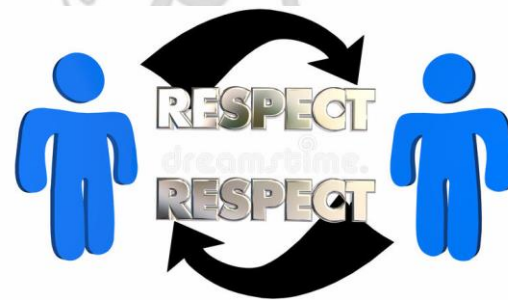
Key Vocabulary	Definition
mutual	A feeling or action shared in common by two or more people
respect	Regard for the feelings, wishes and rights of others
values	Principles or standards of behaviour
imposing	Forcing decisions or ideas on others

Examples of skills

At Wellesley Park, respecting others and our environment is very important to us, as it is one of our key school values. We learn about respect in assemblies and class discussions, and think about how we can show respect to all people in our school and community, regardless of whether we agree with them or not.
